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**LALC's first Local Council Award Scheme (LCAS) Workshop  
has been arranged!**

**About LCAS:**

The National Association of Local Councils (NALC) launched a new Local Council Award Scheme on 5 January 2015, supported by the Society of Local Council Clerks (SLCC) and the Local Government Association (LGA). This replaces what was formerly known as the Quality Town and Parish Council Scheme.

The scheme provides a framework to support local councils in demonstrating how they improve and develop to meet their full potential. It encourages progression by including three award levels: Foundation, Quality and Quality Gold – these offer councils the opportunity to show that they meet the high standards set by the local council sector, are compliant with all legal and procedural requirements, and have a positive ethos regarding sound management, training for both councillors and staff, and an effective programme of community engagement.

As many of you may be aware, LALC are fortunate enough to have a local accreditation panel and we are looking to streamline the assessment of applications from Councils.

We have arranged our first ever LCAS workshop to be held on **Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> May 2020** at the **LALC Office, Dunholme Old School, 8 Market Rasen, Dunholme, 10:00-15:00.**

This workshop is for those councils who would like to know more about the Local Council Award Scheme and for those that may be interested in completing an application at either foundation, quality or gold level.

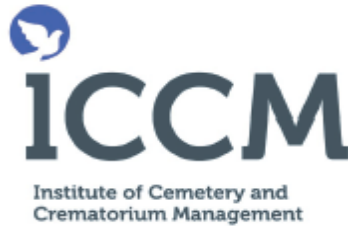

## **Baroness Jane Scott- New President of NALC**

Baroness Jane Scott of Bybrook OBE is the new president of the National Association of Local Councils (NALC), the representative body for England's 10,000 local (parish and town) councils.



The Conservative peer takes over from Liberal Democrat Lord Matthew Taylor of Goss Moor, who stood down after being appointed in 2015.

The appointment was made this week at NALC's Management Board, who had been tasked with securing a new president.

Baroness Scott has been an elected Conservative politician since 1995, serving on North Wiltshire District Council from 1995-2009, and Wiltshire County Council from 1997-2009, where she led the council from 2003. She became leader of the new unitary authority, Wiltshire Council in 2009, and stood down in July 2019.

She was awarded Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) in the 2010 New Year Honours and made a peer in the 2015 Dissolution Honours. She is also a vice-chair of the Local Government Association, and a member of the Grenfell Recovery Task Force set up by the government following the Grenfell fire in 2017.

Baroness Scott, president of NALC, said: "I am truly honoured and delighted to be NALC's president. Especially at such an exciting time for local (parish and town) councils, given their important and growing role in our communities, and the opportunities ahead with a new government and further devolution and community empowerment. I am hugely passionate about local government and the difference it makes to people's lives and our communities, so look forward to working with NALC, which is such a well-respected organisation, to champion and speak up for our first tier of local government, including in parliament."

Cllr Sue Baxter, chairman of NALC said: "I am thrilled Baroness Scott has agreed to take up this prominent and important role, bringing a wealth of local government experience, influence and expertise to NALC. I want to thank Lord Taylor for his support, and I know he will continue to be a good friend and advocate

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## **New Code of Audit Practice**

NALC were pleased to be briefed by the National Audit Office (NAO) on the **new Code of Audit Practice**, which has been laid in Parliament. They are hopeful that the revised Code's emphasis on proportionality and the expectation of better communication around objection work might help address some of the concerns that smaller councils, in particular, have raised with NALC, and which they have raised with the NAO and through the Redmond Review. The new Code comes into force on 1 April 2020 and will apply from audits of local bodies' 2020/21 financial statements onwards. The link to read more details is available via the LALC website.

 Dog waste is permitted only on roadside gulleys with the exception of those parts within the pedestrian crossings.

**All dog owners or guardians are obliged to immediately pick up dog waste by any appropriate means.**

This obligation is enshrined in the new Criminal Code (article R.632-1): "A second class fine is imposed for depositing, abandoning or throwing in a public or private place, with the exception of the places designated for this purpose by the competent administrative authority, rubbish, waste, materials or any other object of any kind whatsoever, if such deposit is not made by the person having the enjoyment of the place or with this person's authorisation ...". In the event of failure to respect this provision, **the offence can lead to a 2nd class fine** the amount of which varies according to the commune or region.

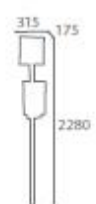

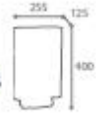
