Over the last few months almost every aspect of our lives have been affected and altered by the Covid -19 virus and it has been a very testing time for all citizens.

We have been busy working supporting the local bus network and ensuring our LCC CallConnect bus service continued to operate over the last few months - however post lock down public transport will be very different and social distancing, hygiene and face covering measures will be in place.

For everyone who travels on public transport please consider carefully the times, routes and ways you travel. This will ensure all will have more space to stay safe. If possible we would encourage travel after peak times for concessionary bus pass holders.

Bus services will continue to change at unusually short notice and consequently timetables at bus stops will not always be updated. We advise passengers to refer to the operator directly via their website or head office. Lincsbus.info is an up to date website of bus services and operators in Lincolnshire. Alternatively- travelline.info and travellineeastmidlands.co.uk helpful website for journey planning.

From Thursday 25<sup>rd</sup> June we will be displaying the attached posters in bus shelters across the whole of Lincolnshire. There are over 800 of these shelters across the whole county so it will take about 4 to 5 days to do this work. 

# Look out for 'bus full' signs


The bus will only stop when people want to get off or if there is enough space onboard
